CURRENT WORDING IN WHOA BY-LAW:

A. The state of Wisconsin is divided into six (6) WAHA regions. Each region shall have one (1) director elected for a three (3) year staggered term. In addition, there shall be three (3) directors at large elected by the Board of Directors, each serving a three (3) year staggered term. The three (3) at large directors must reside in different regions. The following election schedule shall apply:
